Director's Note

In 2016 I saw the touring show of *Hedwig and the Angry Inch* at the Paramount Theater in Seattle. Euan Morton played Hedwig for a glorious 90 minutes, as I sat in awe, the images burned into my brain. I immediately devoured all things John Cameron Mitchell and learned about the history of Hedwig and how they came to be. I'll spare you the gory details, but needless to say, Hedwig somehow managed to both wow and disgust me. I was in love.

Hedwig has always been a controversial and challenging figure. That holds especially true now, when the rights of trans people are under attack from all sides and unfair accusations of grooming and sexual abuse are being wielded as clubs against the community. Hedwig should not and was never intended to be held up as a representation of trans-ness, but rather as a representation of trauma and how it echoes throughout a life. While Hedwig was coerced to undergo an operation to change their physical sex, it is unclear whether Hedwig would have transitioned at all without that coercion. Part of the tragedy of Hedwig's life is that they were denied the opportunity to choose for themselves, and in doing so, they couldn't find an identity that made them feel whole.

The trauma of Hedwig's childhood and their story of survival isn't pretty, but it is incredibly compelling. As a queer individual myself, I identified with Hedwig's struggle to find themselves among the wreckage surrounding them. They may not always do what's moral or just, but I bet most of us can relate to the struggle of growing up in world out of our control while trying to find our own place in it. Hedwig is a flawed and complex character, and they force us to take a hard look at ourselves and consider how we might be perpetuating the cycles of abuse that were forced onto us. At the same time, Hedwig's passion for music, resilience, and stark vulnerability draw us in, but be careful, you might get bit if you get too close.



Ticketing Policies

The Guild accepts MasterCard, VISA, local checks, and cash. As always at BTG: No online ticketing fees!

All purchases are final. No refunds. Given adequate notice, the BTG Ticket Office is happy to exchange tickets when seats are available at another performance. Exchanges can also be made online at your convenience prior to the performance date/time shown on your ticket. No exchanges will be made at the door or after the performance date/time shown on your ticket.

- Thursday through Saturday shows are at 7:30 pm. Sunday matinees are at 2:00 pm. Doors open an hour before curtain. Please arrive at the Playhouse at least 15 minutes before curtain.
- All patrons must have a ticket; no shared seats, no babes in arms.
- Electronic devices must be on silent mode. Do not view screens during performance.
- No video capture or photos of any kind are allowed during shows.
- Shows are not suitable for children 5 and under, unless advertised as such. Some productions may not be suitable for older children or may contain adult language or themes. Contact Ticket Office for further information.

Assistive Listening Devices

Assistive Listening Devices are available to any audience member. These devices cannot be used in conjunction with hearing aids. You must leave an ID as security for the device, claimable after the performance. Contact an usher to arrange usage.
